The 15th annual Fleet Farm Minnesota Fishing Challenge is set for Saturday, June 3, 2023. The event will take place on Gull Lake near Brainerd. The Fishing Challenge, hosted by Al Lindner with honorary tournament director Steve Pennaz, is a multi-species fundraising tournament. Two-person teams may elect to fish any of five divisions.

This will be an exciting weekend of fishing fun! It will start with a great "Rules Dinner" in Brainerd on Friday evening, June 2 and end with the weigh-in event at Cragun's Resort on Saturday, June 3. ABOUT MN ADULT & TEEN CHALLENGE



Mn Adult & Teen Challenge (MnTC) is a drug and alcohol treatment and recovery program that has been in operation since 1983. We serve people ages 13-74 years with 14 locations throughout the state with a full range of services including long-term recovery and short-term intensive treatment programs. Additionally, our Know the Truth™ Prevention Program speaks in more than 160 high schools and middle schools across the state, sharing personal stories of addiction with students to help prevent substance use.

Bring in one rock bass, and this weight will be added to the total weight in any division.

Weigh-in Scales Open at 1 p.m.

All boats must check-in no later than 3 p.m. at Cragun's Resort.

Teams arriving earlier than the deadline will help streamline the weigh-in process.

You don't want to miss this, even if your livewell is empty! Weigh bags will be delivered to your boat, and information will be shared with you about approaching the weigh station. On shore, you will find plenty of great conversation with other anglers, excitement of watching the weigh-in, and enjoy listening to songs of hope from the MnTC men's choir.

Thousands of dollars in prizes will be awarded to top anglers from the incredible prize tent! Many other awards will also be presented at the end of the day on Cragun's beach.

Prizes and Awards

Division Prizes

The top 10 teams in each division (50 teams!) will be entitled to a trip through the prize tent for your team with a combined team prize valued at a minimum of \$100 each. Nearly \$20,000 in prizes will be available including rods, reels, tackle, trolling motors, guided fishing trips, gear and much more.

Additional Fishing Prizes

- Sea Foam Second Chance Awards Ten teams with fish but not placing in the top 10 of their division, (total 20 individual winners) will win a case of Sea Foam Marine Pro Motor Treatment. Anglers must be present during the drawing to win!
- **McDonald's Biggest Bass Award** The winning team will receive a plaque and a giant Rapala lure autographed by the staff of Lindner Media.
- Woods to Water Real Estate Biggest Walleye Award A plaque and a giant Rapala lure autographed by the staff of Lindner Media will be awarded to the winner.
- **Beaudry Oil Ugliest Fish Award** The winning team will receive a plaque and bragging rights!
- **Sea Foam Scholarship** The top three ranked student teams will receive two \$500 college scholarships. It doesn't matter what division and student team does not have to be in the top ten of the division. For example, winners could be 5th place in the walleye division, 7th in the mixed bag, and 10th in the bass division.

Team Recruitment Award

Help us fill the event to the 150-team limit again this year. Last year we raised over \$500,000 and with your help we can reach our goal of going even higher. **Each team that recruits a new team will be entered in a drawing to win a \$1,000 Fleet Farm shopping spree!** New teams consist of both partners who have not fished the event previously. You get one entry for each new team you sign up! You must be listed as the team who invited them on their entry form to get credit for it.

Early Bird Awards

Enter now and start your fundraising right away! Five teams who register by April 1 will be eligible for Early Bird prizes including AquaVu cameras, or fishing gear. One winning team will win complimentary lodging for six people (Wednesday before the MN Fishing Challenge through Saturday, June 3) at Sandy Beach Resort on Gull Lake's west shoreline. Both team members must be registered to qualify for these Early Bird prizes.

Fundraising Ideas & Resources



Fundraise via e-mail, social media and other online platforms.

In order to fundraise online, you will need to set up a giving page. Follow the easy steps below:

If you registered online: When registering online, you were asked to create a username and password. This is your log-in information needed to work with your online donation page.

If you registered by mail: Once your registration arrived, an online fundraising page was created in your team's name. If you provided an email address on your registration form you should have received an email with a direct link to the participant center and your online fundraising page.

Follow these steps to get started:

- #1: Check your email for a direct link to your fundraising page.
- #2: Walk through each of the tabs on this page to update each of these sections: Overview, Story, Donations, Emails, and Details.
- #3: Click around on this page for many other ways to access and/or update your page.

Customize your fundraising page, and check your progress anytime.

- #1: Go to fishingchallenge.org
- #2: Click on the "register now" page and go to the upper right corner and click on the "Go To" dropdown list.
- #3: You can choose either your personal page or your team page from this dropdown list.
- #4: You can send links to your page with the little gray envelope, or you can use the resources through the "manage" button in the top right corner. You will want to connect with potential donors and send thank you notes often.

2023 Minnesota Fishing Challenge Rules & Regulations

I. Participants and Eligibility

- A. Contestants must register online at fishingchallenge.org OR use a paper official registration form and mail the \$200 entry fee per team to Mn Adult & Teen Challenge, 2424 Business 371, Brainerd. MN 56401. Confirmations will be mailed or emailed.
- B. Contestants may pay with check, money order or credit card.
- C. This is a two-person per boat fishing tournament. If both contestants are under age 16, a non-fishing guardian or parent must be present in the boat.
- D. Contestants must attend the Friday, June 2, 2023 Rules Dinner at Heritage Assembly of God church in Baxter. Celebrity anglers and special guests will make this a great event, along with any last minute instructions. Meal is free.
- E. Special fishing trips and other adult and youth contestant prizes will be awarded by draw at the rules meeting.
- F. Contestants over 16 must possess a valid Minnesota fishing license.

II. Team Sponsorship Challenge

- A. Teams are urged to raise team sponsorship funds and to begin the fundraising process as soon as possible. The minimum amount requested that each team raise for your team is \$500; there is no maximum. Top fundraising teams will win fishing trips with Al Lindner, Steve Pennaz, or Den Pluimer.
- B. When you register online, an automatic online donation web page will be created for your team. This page will allow you to watch your donations grow and will keep all "Fishing Challenge" info at your fingertips. Call Sue or Mark, 218-833-8752 for suggestions and assistance. (If you register with a paper registration form, a donation web page will set up and you will be notified of how to access it)
- C. A number of items will be available to help you with your fundraising, including a video! Share the video with friends, church family, businesses, groups, Facebook, etc., to enhance fundraising and attract new teams.
- D. Fundraising money collected should be sent to Mn Adult &Teen Challenge as soon as they are gathered. Postage-paid envelopes will be provided for your team if requested.
- E. Sponsorship funds (100% tax deductible) raised to support your team's donation to Mn Adult & Teen Challenge must be submitted to MnTC prior to or at registration at the Rules Dinner to be considered for any prizes.
- F. A raffle with very attractive prizes makes additional fundraising even easier. (Tickets will be available for all team members to sell to friends and family!)
- G. A full list of prizes is available. Subject to change.

III. Scoring

- A. Anglers must declare before fish are weighed which division they intend to enter. There are five divisions: Walleye, Bass, Pike, Panfish, and Mixed Bag.
 - · Walleye: teams may weigh three walleyes
 - \bullet Bass: teams may weigh three largemouth
 - · Pike: teams may weigh only one northern
 - Panfish: teams may weigh a maximum of three panfish (bluegill, sunfish, crappie, rock bass, or perch in any combination)
 - · Mixed Bag: combination of one panfish, one walleye, one bass, and one pike
- B. One rock bass will be the bonus "kicker" fish and added to any division. (If you already have rock bass in your mixed bag collection, an additional rock bass is your bonus "kicker".)
- C. Weigh-in headquarters: Cragun's Resort on Gull Lake. Scales open at 1:00pm; main weigh-in at 3:00pm.
- D. Ties will be settled by a coin toss.
- E. Plaques will be awarded for the ugliest fish, biggest walleye, and biggest bass.

IV. Tournament Format

- A. Tournament boundaries are the entire Gull Lake Chain.
- B. Launch at any ramp or resort.
- C. Scales open at 1 p.m. Teams may weigh a limit for any species only once.
- D. Contestants may be on the water and at their fishing destinations, but may not begin fishing until 7 a.m. (CST) on June 3, 2023.
- E. All boats must return to Cragun's Resort no later than 3 p.m. (CST) on June 3, 2023.
- F. Teams returning earlier than the 3 p.m. deadline will streamline the weigh-in process.
- G. Artificial lures and live bait are allowed.
- H. Each competitor must observe safe boat conduct, no-wake zones, and local navigation rules. Competitors are expected to demonstrate courtesy and act in a sportsmanlike manner.
- The tournament director will interpret rules according to the spirit and intent of the rule and his
 decision in all matters is final.
- J. All prizes and trophies will be awarded from the weigh-in stage immediately upon completion of the tournament. Winners must be present to collect prizes or they will be forfeited.

2023 Student Angler Teams Rules and Regulations

- Age requirement: Any team wishing to enter the student division must have two anglers who are 2023 high school graduates or younger. Anglers may be 18 years old if they are recent graduates, but all student division boats must include one additional person in the boat who serves as the adult boat captain.
- The primary responsibility of the boat captain is operation of the boat and oversee the safety of the students, but does not fish. The captain can net fish but cannot handle the fish. Only the students can fish and bring fish to the scale. Boat captains will be responsible to know and understand the rules and ensure they are followed.
- Student anglers will compete in the tournament along with the main body of anglers. We will not be using an app to register fish. Student teams can enter any of the five divisions.
- Student anglers will bring their fish to the weigh-in and go through the prize tent if they finish in the top 10 of the division they enter.
- The top three student angler teams will be awarded \$1,000 in college scholarships from Sea Foam, \$500 per team member. This award will be given to the top 3 teams overall and is not limited to one division. (Example: we could have a 3rd place in bass, a 5th place in walleye and a 7th place in panfish.) Ties will be broken by the flip of a coin.
- Student angler entry fee is \$200 per team.
